### Take Part – It's Easy!

There are many ways to participate in this partnership opportunity. Here are a few:

#### *Inspire:*

- Write a blog post about Good Deeds Day and share it with your volunteers and with the Network.

### Equip:

### Mobilize:

### 8 DIY Ideas for Good Deeds Day

- 1. Gather a group of people to write 'thank you' or 'just because' cards for people
- 2. Encourage others to find unneeded items in their house and donate them to a charitable organization.
- 3. Get a group together to clean up a local park
- 4. Put a donation bin in local coffee shops and collect at the end of the month
- 5. Set up a pop-up clothing <u>street store</u> for the community
- 6. Invite groups to put together baskets for shelters ask everyone to bring hotel shampoos, soaps, combs, tissues, etc., then donate the packages
- 7. Contact your local nursing home and offer to come spend time with the residents (ex: Bingo Night, games, story telling!)
- 8. Host a sandwich making event to make lunches for hungry children
